## 1909 MATHEWS CO. CONFEDERATE PENSION LIST

AFTER THE CIVIL WAR ENDED, THE PROBLEM OF DISABLED CONFEDERATE SOLDIERS AND WIDOWS CAME BEFORE THE VIRGINIA LEGISLATURE SEVERAL TIMES. IN 1888, THE LEGISLATURE APPROVED PAYMENT OF PENSIONS OF WIDOWS AND SOLDIERS KILLED IN ACTION OR WHO DIED IN SERVICE AND THOSE WHO WERE SEVERELY MAIMED WHILE WEARING THE GRAY. IN 1900, AS WELL AS 1902 AS THE VETERAN POPULATION AGED, SOME OF THE RESTRICTIONS WERE LIFTED.

THE PROCEDURE FOLLOWED WAS THAT THE VETERAN OR WIDOW FILLED OUT AN APPLICATION FOR A PENSION. THIS APPLICATION WAS THEN PRESENTED TO A LOCAL PENSION BOARD FOR REVIEW. THE PENSION APPLICATIONS WERE NOT KEPT AT THE COUNTY LEVEL. THEY ARE HOUSED IN THE STATE ARCHIVES. THE LIBRARY OF VIRGINIA CAN SUPPLY A COPY.

IF YOUR ANCESTOR WAS A UNION SOLDIER HIS APPLICATION WILL BE IN THE NATIONAL ARCHIVES IN D.C.

A WEALTH OF INFORMATION IS CONTAINED IN THESE APPLICATIONS.

THE CHILDREN OF PVT. SAMUEL SMITH JR. OF KNOTT CO. KY. WERE RECENTLY HONORED AS THE LAST LIVING DESCENDANTS OF PVT SMITH. BY THE SONS OF CONFEDERATE VETERANS. OPAL SMITH WILLIAMS AND EARL SMITH THE LAST OF 22 CHILDREN BORN OF TWO MARRIAGES FOR MR. SMITH. WHO WAS BORN IN 1844 AND DIED IN 1937. HE SERVED IN CO. I THE 13TH. KY. CAV.

## TO REST IN THE SHADE OF TREES

LYNCHBURG VIRGINIA WAS THE SOUTH'S LARGEST OUTPOST HOSPITAL CENTER DURING THE CIVIL WAR. MORE THAN FIFTY SURGEONS FROM ALL PARTS OF THE COUNTRY TOILED THERE, RELIEVING WHAT SUFFERING THEY COULD AS THEY DEALT WITH THE RAVAGES OF GUNSHOT, GANGRENE AND SMALLPOX. AT LEAST 20,000 PATIENTS CAME THROUGH LYNCHBURG DURING THE COURSE OF THE WAR, AND MORE THAN 2,000 OF THEM ARE STILL THERE.

THE CONFEDERATE SECTION OF LYNCHBURG'S OLD CITY CEMETERY, CONTAINS WITHIN A BRICK WALL, THE GRAVES OF 2,200 CONFEDERATE SOLDIERS WHO DIED IN THE CITY'S MAKESHIFT HOSPITALS. THE GRAVES WERE UNMARKED UNTIL 1896, WHEN THE SOUTHERN MEMORIAL ASSOCIATION BEGAN THE PLACEMENT OF HEADSTONES ON THE GRAVES BEARING THE SOLDIER'S INITIALS, COMPANY, REGIMENT, AND STATE. THIS PROJECT WAS COMPLETED IN 1915.

IN PLACING THE HEADSTONES THE MEMORIAL ASSOCIATION RELIED UPON THE THOROUGH RECORDS OF THE W.D. DIUGUID FUNERAL HOME, BEING THE SECOND OLDEST IN THE NATION. THEIR CIVIL WAR RECORDS ARE A HISTORIC TREASURE. THEY INCLUDE THE SOLDIERS' NAMES, REGIMENTS, PLACES OF DEATH, COFFIN DIMENSIONS AND BURIAL ARRANGEMENTS.

THE UNDERTAKER'S LEDGER FOR MAY 20TH, 1861 BRINGS THE FIRST OF MANY APPEARANCES OF A HEADING WRITTEN IN ELEGANT SCRIPT: "SOUTHERN CONFEDERACY". BENEATH THE ORNATE INSCRIPTION, THE ENTRY SIMPLY STATES - THOMAS P. PLUCKETT, BY CASH OF CAPT. WILLIAMS, \$10.00. THE FIRST OF 2,000 GRAVES HAD BEEN DUG. A WEEK LATER COMES THE SECOND ENTRY: WILLIAM E. BRITTON, 1ST. TENN. BY CASH OF CAPT. WILLIAMS, \$10.00. A STEADY PROCESSION OF THE SOUTH'S FINEST FOLLOWED: THE GREENBRIAR RIFLES: THE COOPER GUARDS: THE JASPER RIFLES: THE PORTSMOUTH LIGHT ARTILLERY.

IN THE HUNDREDS OF PAGES THAT FOLLOW, THE UNDERTAKER OCCASIONALLY NOTES FASCINATING DETAILS WHICH PROVIDE VIVID GLIMPSES OF THE BUSINESS OF DEATH DURING THE WAR.

SOME ENTRIES POIGNANTLY ALLOW THE WAR'S TRAGIC REALITIES TO TOUCH US ACROSS GENERATIONS. IN THE DAYS BEFORE DOG TAGS AND DENTAL RECORDS MANY A SOLDIER DIED IN ANONYMITY, AS THE LAST PERSON ON EARTH TO LOOK UPON A YOUNG, UNIDENTIFIED FACE. DIUGUID'S UNDERTAKER STOPS TO RECORD INFORMATION WHICH MIGHT ONE DAY SETTLE THE MIND OF A SEARCHING PARENT, "OR IN OUR CASE OF A G.G. GRANDSON OR DAUGHTER"

J. C. GRAHAM, CO. F. 23RD. GA. REG. WAS BURIED #2 IN LINE #2 OF LOT #177. A CHILD WHICH WAS FOUND IN BLACKWATER CREEK WAS PUT IN SAME GRAVE.

AN UNKNOWN YOUNG MAN 18 OR 20 YEARS OLD ABOUT 5 FT. 8 IN. HIGH. LIGHT HAIR. NO BEARD. SHARP NOSE. UPPER TEETH PROJECTING AND SLIGHTLY DECAYED MARK OF BLISTER ON HIS BREAST, HAD ON GRAY GERSEY PANTS AND WHITE SHIRT MUCH WORN. A KHAKI SHIRT, GRAY OVERCOAT AND WHITE BLANKET IN THE COFFIN. HE WAS BARE FOOTED. HE WAS PICKED UP AT GORDENSVILLE ABOUT THE 17TH. OF JAN'Y 1862 AND WAS BURIED #4 IN SECOND LINE LOT #170 ON THE 27TH. OF JAN. 1862.

WHEN THE SOLDIER'S IDENTITY WAS KNOWN, THE FUNERAL PARLOR APPARENTLY OFTEN HAD THE TASK OF NOTIFYING FAMILY MEMBERS, AS RECORDS SHOW.

WILLIAM LAWRENCE ACKERMAN, ORLEANS RIFLES, 6TH. LA. REG. WAS BURIED #7 FIRST LINE LOT #156. JUNE 18TH, 1861. HIS FATHER IS A SHOE MAKER ON MAZZINE ST. BETWEEN CLIO AND ERATO STREETS NEW ORLEANS.



IF NATHANIEL PEARCE OF CO.A. 24TH. NC. REGIMENT SHOULD DIE HEAR. HE IS TO BE PACKED UP AND KEPT AND WE MUST WRITE TO J.W.PEARCE, VANHOOKS STORE, PERSON CO. NC.

EVIDENTLY. CONTACT WITH THOSE RELATIVES WAS NOT ALWAYS MADE:

C.CARTER, CO. E. 16TH. MIF. WAS PACKED IN CHARCOAL. FEB. 4TH. 1862. AND IS STILL IN OUR POSSESSION <MAY.14TH.> A LATER NOTATION STATES THAT C. CARTER WAS FINALLY BURIED MARCH 30TH. 1868! 6 YEARS LATER.

SEVERAL GRIM ENTRIES REVEAL THAT SOME SOLDIERS DID EVENTUALLY MAKE IT HOME.AFTER ALL:

J.ROEBUCK. CO.G.3RD S.C. WAS BURIED #3 IN 4TH LINE,LOT #159, TAKEN UP 6TH.OF OCT. AND SENT TO LAURENS CH. S.C.

GEORGE W. WHEELER OF CAPT. BROWN'S CO. 12TH.ALABAMA, WAS PACKED UP ON THE 10TH. OF OCT. TO BE SENT HOME AND STAYED IN OUR POSSESSION UNTIL NOV. 4TH. 1861 WITHOUT BECOMING OFFENSIVE. HIS COUSIN A.B.LOWREY OWES US \$15.00 ON HIM.

THE CLOSE OF THE YEAR 1861 HAD SEEN 127 CONFEDERATES LAID TO REST IN LYNCHBURG. ON JUNE 1ST. 1862 SHOWS TO DATE 374. ON NEW YEARS EVE, 1863 THE COUNT HAD PASSED 2.000.

ONCE THE UNION ENDED THE PRACTICE OF PRISONER EXCHANGES. THE NUMBER OF YANKEE PRISONERS BURIED IN LYNCHBURG BEGINS TO RISE. WITH 58 IN JULY OF 1862 ALONE. THE DECEASED YANKEES WERE THOUGHTFULLY SEGREGATED IN A PERIPHERAL AREA KNOWN AS " YANKEE SQUARE." SO AS NOT TO DESECRATE THE RESTING PLACE OF THE BOYS IN GRAY. AFTER THE WAR. THE CONQUERING FEDERAL GOVERNMENT CAME TO LYNCHBURG AND EXHUMED THEIR DEAD, MOVING 187 UNION CORPSES TO A FEDERAL GRAVEYARD NEAR NORFOLK. BEGINNING IN LOT #1 IN 1ST. LINE.#1. CAPT.EDMOND KEYS. CO.B.116 TH. OHIO WOULD BE #43.

AFTER THE WAR. ENTRIES CONTINUED FOR CONFEDERATE DEATHS INTO 1866. WHEN THE LAST CASUALTY APPEARED. THE SMALL HEADSTONES IN THE CEMETERY'S MARBLED FURROWS ARE HUMBLE MEMORIALS AND SHOULD REMIND US OF ALL THE NAMELESS WARRIORS WHO REST WITH OUR HEADSTONES IN FORGOTTEN FIELDS THROUGHOUT THE UNITED STATES.

### WHO'S HALLOWED GRAVE

ON A WORM OCTOBER DAY IN 1995, A SMALL FUNERAL PROCESSION SLOWLY MOVED TOWARD A BURIAL SITE AT ST. JOHN'S EPISCOPAL CHURCH IN CENTERVILLE VIRGINIA. ONLY TWO PALL BEARERS CARRIED THE TWO SMALL BOXES. THE REINTERMENT OF TWO CONFEDERATE SOLDIERS, ONE FROM VIRGINIA AND THE OTHER FROM SOUTH CAROLINA. WERE FIRST BURIED IN 1861. 134 YEARS BEFORE. THE PRIEST CAREFULLY CONSULTED A BOOK OF COMMON PRAYER DATED 1789. FOR THE BURIAL OF THE DEAD THAT WOULD HAVE BEEN USED IN 1861. TO INSURE AUTHENTICITY.



THE SAGA HAD BEGUN TWO YEARS EARLIER WHEN ST. JOHN'S CONGREGATION FELT THE NEED TO ENLARGE IT'S FACILITIES. CONSTRUCTION WAS HALTED UPON THE DISCOVERY OF UNMARKED GRAVES.

A TEAM OF HERITAGE RESOURCES WORKERS AND VOLUNTEER ARCHEOLOGICAL FIELD AND LABORATORY TEAMS FROM NORTHERN VIRGINIA AS WELL AS THE SMITHSONIAN INSTITUTION, HASTILY WENT TO WORK. THE TWO SOLDIERS AS WELL AS FOUR CIVILIANS WERE FOUND. THE TWO SOLDIER'S REMAINS WERE CAREFULLY EXHUMED AND LABELED FOR FORENSIC EXAMINATION.

THE FIRST CHURCH WAS BUILT IN 1851, AND WAS USED AS A HOSPITAL DURING THE WAR AND SUSTAINED CONSIDERABLE DAMAGE. THE PRESENT "OLD" PORTION OF THE CHURCH WAS REBUILT IN 1867, AND WAS SURROUNDED ON THREE SIDES BY A CEMETERY, WHOSE LEGIBLE STONES DATE TO 1860.

MANY GRAVES WERE UNMARKED, AND WHEN THE CHURCH WAS ENLARGED IN THE 1950S, AN UNKNOWN NUMBER OF GRAVES WERE AFFECTED. IT WAS NOT UNTIL THE EXPANSION OF 1993 THAT THE GRAVES WERE DISCOVERED. SEVERAL OF WHICH SHOWED IMPACT DAMAGE AND PARTIAL SKELETAL LOSS DATING TO THE EARLIER CONSTRUCTION PERIOD.

THROUGH THE EXTENSIVE WORK OF ARCHAEOLOGIST, LARRY MOORE, IT WAS LEARNED THAT ONE OF THE "CIVILIAN" BURIALS WAS ACTUALLY THAT OF ANOTHER CONFEDERATE VETERAN, ISAAC NEWTON FRANKLIN, A MEMBER OF "MOSBY'S COMMAND" IN THE 43 RD. BATTALION, VA. CALVARY. THE MOSBY ROSTER DESCRIBES HIM AS 5 FT. 11 IN. WITH RUDDY COMPLEXION, BROWN HAIR AND HAZEL EYES, A BASIC DESCRIPTION CONSISTENT WITH THE FORENSIC EXAMINATION, HAVING DIED IN THE 1900'S, AND BURIED ALONGSIDE HIS WIFE AND DAUGHTER.

WHEN DR. DWSLEY AND ASSOCIATE KARIN SANDNESS, OF THE SMITHSONIAN, BEGAN FORENSIC EXAMINATION, THE SKELETAL REMAINS PROVIDED SUBSTANTIAL CLUES.

ALTHOUGH ONLY THE UPPER PORTION OF EACH BODY WAS PRESENT AND 130 PLUS YEARS HAD PASSED HIS EXAMINATION DETERMINED THAT BOTH WERE MEN FROM 33 TO 39 YEARS OLD, MORE IMPORTANTLY, IN ADDITION TO A FEW SHREDS OF CLOTH AND A SMALL PATCH OF HAIR THE GRAVES YIELDED SEVERAL BRASS CONFEDERATE MILITARY BUTTONS, ONE FROM VIRGINIA AND TWO FROM SOUTH CAROLINA, BURIED WITH OUT A COFFIN UNDER A WOODEN SHELTER POSSIBLY MADE FROM A CHURCH PEW, FORMING A "WOODEN SHELL" OVER THEM. ONE BODY SEEMED TO HAVE BEEN COVERED WITH A BLANKET OR COAT, PARTICLES OF WITCH ADHERED TO THE BRASS BUTTONS OF THE SOUTH CAROLINIAN'S REMAINS, THE YOUNG VIRGINIAN WAS SIMILARLY BURIED, COVERED BY A WOODEN SHELL WHICH HAD BEEN PUT TOGETHER WITH CUT NAILS, SINCE SEVERAL BUTTONS WERE FOUND AROUND HIS HEAD, IT WAS ASSUMED THAT A UNIFORM WAS ROLLED UP TO FORM A PILLOW. SMALL SHREDS OF CLOTH ATTACHED TO THE OLD VIRGINIA BUTTON WERE OF A LIGHT BROWN COLOR SOMETIMES REFERRED TO " BUTTERNUT "

ONE OF THE ARCHAEOLOGICAL VOLUNTEERS, PAT GALLAGHER OF RESTON, VA. BECAME INTRIGUED WITH THE MYSTERY AND DECIDED TO TRY AND FIND WHO THE MEN MIGHT BE. SHE NARROWED THE SCOPE OF THE SEARCH TO FIVE CASUALTIES FROM THE 11TH, VIRGINIA, OF WHOM ONLY TWO MET THE BASIC AGE CRITERION, HENERY L. GOULDEN AND WILLIAM H. HOBSON, BOTH WERE PRIVATES: BOTH HAD BEEN FARMERS IN LYNCHBURG VIRGINIA: BOTH WERE 36 YEARS OF AGE: AND BOTH WERE KILLED IN ACTION AT THE BATTLE OF DRANESVILLE. THERE WERE 13 SOUTH CAROLINIANS LOST IN THE BATTLE BECAUSE THE STATES RECORDS OMITTED MANY AGES, EVEN AN ATTEMPT AT IDENTIFICATION WAS IMPOSSIBLE. MRS. GALLAGHER WAS ANXIOUS TO IDENTIFY THE TWO YOUNG MEN AND FINALLY IN 1993 SENT GENERAL LETTERS OF INQUIRY TO THE UDC AND SCV REQUESTING HELP.

IN 1994 SHE CONTACTED THE FAIRFAX CHAPTER DIRECTLY AND ASKED IF IT WOULD BE INTERESTED IN HELPING ATTEMPT TO IDENTIFY THE VIRGINIA SOLDIER. SHE FINALLY HAD STUMBLER UPON A GROUP WHO ACCEPTED HER CHALLENGE. OPERATING ON THE



PREMISE THAT IF SOMEONE KNEW WHERE ONE OF THE MEN HAD BEEN BURIED. PERHAPS BACK IN HIS HOME AREA. CHANCES WERE GOOD THAT THE REMAINS BELONGED TO THE OTHER INDIVIDUAL. UNFORTUNATELY. NO OTHER INFORMATION WAS UNCOVERED. AND ON A WORM OCTOBER DAY ACCOMPANIED BY GREY-CLAD REENACTORS. FAIRFAX UDC MEMBERS AND SCV CAMP MEMBERS, WHO HAD PROVIDED ONE OF THE IRON CROSSES TO MARK THE GRAVES, THE TWO "REBELS" WERE LAID TO REST WITH OUT SPECIFIC IDENTIFICATION.

AT THE CONCLUSION OF THE ORDER OF BURIAL, THE MOURNERS REACHED INTO A SMALL BAG OF DIRT THAT HAD BEEN CAREFULLY PRESERVED FROM THE ORIGINAL EXHUMATION AND SPRINKLED IT ON THE NEW WOODEN BOXES AS THEY WERE INTERRED. THE CEREMONIAL DIGNITY DESERVED BY THESE TWO HAD BEEN GIVEN THEM. THEIR NAMES KNOWN ONLY TO GOD.

WHITE SULPHUR SPRINGS, IN MONTGOMERY CO. VIRGINIA. BECAME A HOSPITAL IN MAY OF 1862. WITH SEVEN SURGEONS AND FOUR PHYSICIANS. ALSO ASSISTING WOULD BE FIVE NUNS FROM THE CHARITY OF OUR LADY OF MERCY IN SOUTH CAROLINA. RECORDS SHOW THAT AS A LAUNDRESS AND COOK THE PAY WAS \$25.00 PER MONTH, WHILE NURSES RECEIVED \$20.00.

FROM THE BEGINNING OF THE HOSPITAL THERE WERE MANY SICK AND WOUNDED SOLDIERS. FROM JUNE, 1863, THROUGH DEC. 1863. THERE WAS AN AVERAGE OF 650 PATIENTS PER MONTH AND A TOTAL OF 244 GUNSHOT WOUNDS. A COMPLETE LIST OF SOLDIERS WHO DIED AT THE HOSPITAL HAS NOT BEEN FOUND. A PARTIAL LIST COMPILED FROM SERVICE RECORDS IN THE NATIONAL ARCHIVES. BY MR. RAYMOND W. WATKINS LIST 265 NAMES.

SOLDIERS INTERRED IN THE CEMETERY WERE FROM ALABAMA, FLORIDA, GEORGIA, KENTUCKY, LOUISIANA, MISSISSIPPI, NORTH CAROLINA, SOUTH CAROLINA, TEXAS, TENNESSEE AND VIRGINIA. AT ONE TIME THE GRAVES WERE MARKED WITH WOODEN HEADSTONES. BUT OVER TIME THOSE HAVE DISAPPEARED AND ONLY ONE GRAVE HAS A HEADSTONE. THAT OF PVT. J. EDD CLARK. 4TH. TEXAS INFANTRY. HE ENLISTED ON APRIL 11TH. 1862 AND DIED ON SEPT. 20TH. 1863. TRADITION HAS IT THAT HIS PARENTS CAME FROM TEXAS AFTER THE WAR AND HAD THE STONE PLACED THERE.

IN 1889 THE MONTGOMERY CO. MEMORIAL ASS. CRECTED A MONUMENT AT THE RESORT TO HONOR ALL WHO DIED THERE.

#### THE OLD DOMINION BANNER

AT THE BEGINNING OF THE WAR BETWEEN THE STATES THERE WAS NO OFFICIAL FLAG FOR THE STATE OF VIRGINIA. UPON HER SECEDING FROM THE UNION. ON APRIL 17. 1861 A FLAG WAS ADOPTED.

ON OCTOBER 30. 1861. GOVERNOR JOHN LETCHER PRESENTED ONE OF THE NEW FLAGS TO EACH VIRGINIA REGIMENT ENCAMPED NEAR MANASSAS.

THIS FLAG WAS A FIELD OF BLUE WITH THE GRATE SEAL OF THE COMMONWEALTH IN THE CENTER. THIS SEAL WAS ADOPTED IN 1776. WITH THE WORDS "VIRGINIA" AND THE STATE MOTTO "SIC SEMPER TYANNIS" LATIN FOR "THUS ALWAYS TO TYRANTS"

AS JOHN WILKS BOOTH LAY DYING. AFTER HE HAD ASSASSINATED ABRAHAM LINCOLN. HE REPEATED THESE WORDS.

IN 1930 THE STATE ASSEMBLY VOTED TO ADOPT A NEW DESIGN.

VIRGINIA'S FLAG IS AMONG ONLY THREE STATE FLAGS EXISTING TODAY THAT WERE FLOWN AS STATE FLAGS DURING THE CIVIL WAR. INCLUDED ARE THE STATES OF SOUTH CAROLINA AND TEXAS.

VIRGINIA WAS READMITTED TO THE UNION ON JUNE 20 1870

THE CARTER FAMILY OF COKE

JAMES AND JUDY CARTERS' BIRTH DATES AND PLACES UNKNOWN. WERE THE PARENTS OF AT LEAST TWO SONS WHO LIVED IN COKE. GLOUCESTER CO. VIRGINIA. BOTH WERE MARRIED AT "SHELLY PLANTATION" THE HOME OF THE PAGE FAMILY. THIS WAS SHORTLY AFTER THE CIVIL WAR. AND IMMEDIATELY AFTER CHRISTMAS IN 1866. I THOUGHT IT INTERESTING THAT THIS WAS NOT A DOUBLE WEDDING. BUT ONE DAY APART. JAMES AND JUDY WERE SLAVES AT "SHELLY" THIS IS WHY THEIR SONS WERE MARRIED THERE. AND THE LAND THE CARTER FAMILY OWNS TODAY ON CARTERS CREEK. SHELLY SIDE, WAS A PART OF THE ORIGINAL SHELLY LAND.

ONE DEED FOUND WAS DATED 1834 FROM MAN PAGE. PROPERTY = CARTERS CREEK = TO WILLIAM HUGHES. I FOUND NO DEEDS FROM PAGE TO THE CARTERS. THEREFOR I PRESUME THAT THE CARTER LAND CAME FROM THE HUGHES FAMILY.
