CRADOCK SCHOOL
OPENS SESSIONS
400 Pupils Enrolled on First
Day Out of Total of
500 Expected
HIGH SCHOOL PUPILS
GO TO DEEP CREEK
The Cradock public school opened
yesterday morning with an enroll-
ment of 400 pupils, which is about
equivalent to the number enrolled
on the first day a year ago.
County School Superintendent Hurst
stated yesterday that he expected a
total of 500 pupils to enroll in the
school before the end of the week.
A corps of twelve teachers has been
assigned to the school under the di-
rection of H. Wilson Thorpe, princi-
pal of the school.
Some of the teachers were not on
hand yesterday morning when school
opened, because of various reasons,
but all are expected to report today
and tomorrow.
Transfer of High School
There is to be no high school this
year at Cradock, Mr. Hurst announced,
and fifteen high school pupils have
enrolled at the Deep Creek School.
A number of them are also attending
the Woodrow Wilson High School
here.
The Cradock school is to be oper-
ated this year under an arrange-
ment with Norfolk County. The
board of supervisors, in a meeting
held in the city last week adopted a
motion to the effect "that the amount
of taxes derived from the taxation of
personal property in the town of
Cradock for schools and county fund
be allocated to the public schools in
Cradock."
By this arrangement it will be
possible for the school to go forward
under county direction. The com-
munity is furnishing the building and
will also look after the maintenance
of the structure during the session.
It is understood.
