WESTCOTT.--Sarah J. Baker, wife of E. S. Westcott, departed this life at the residence of her daughter, Mrs. C. H. Towne, of Philadelphia, February 9, 1895, in the seventieth year of her age. Mrs. Westcott was born in New York City, where she resided for the greater part of her life. She was married to her now bereaved husband over fifty years ago, and for a few years thereafter, they resided in Fairhaven, Conn., where both were converted and united with the Methodist Episcopal Church in 1848. Returning to New York City, they resided for many years in Tremont, and later in Harlem, where they united with Calvary Methodist Episcopal Church, of which they continued acceptable members until her death. For the last five years they had spent their summers at Asbury Park, going

to Florida for the winter. Mrs. Westcott had been in feeble health for several months. On their way South, as they tarried for a visit with their daughter, her health failed so rapidly that it became impossible to proceed. In much suffering she lingered until death came to her relief. For forty-six years, she had maintained a quiet, firm, consistent, exemplary Christian life, abiding in the affections and confidence of her family and friends. With remarkable composure she gave minute directions concerning matters involved in her expected departure, and, with unclouded faith, waited the final summons. To the last she was conscious, and within five minutes of her death gave affectionate tokens of recognition of friends and of steady faith. The mother of five children, one son and four daughters, the youngest of whom is the wife of Dr. Harold Havelock Kynett, of Philadelphia, she was the first to break, by death, a loving family circle. A sad incident of the bereavement is the total blindness of her bereaved husband, which has stolen upon him gradually within the last few months. Nevertheless, in this great loss and bereavement divine grace gives him supernatural calmness and comfort. Under it all he can say, "Thy glorious face is leaning toward me, and its holy light shines in upon my lonely dwelling place, and there is no more night."

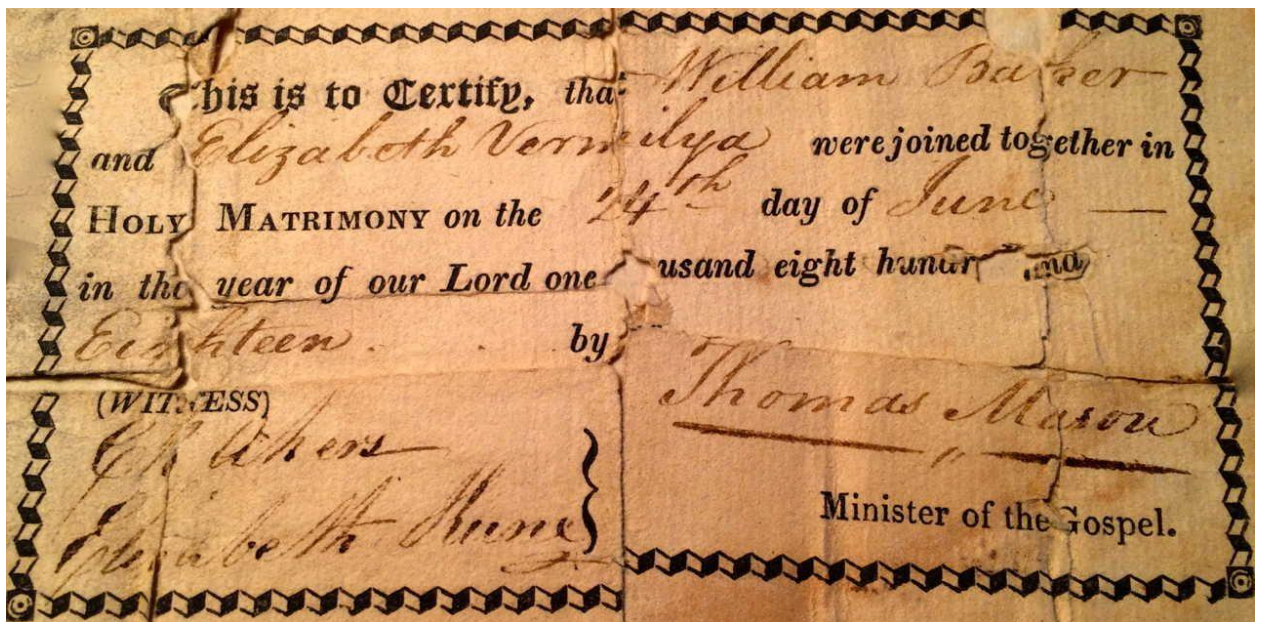
