



ADJOINING St. Mary's church is a parish cemetery which is 103 or 104 years old as indicated by some of the grave markers. This monument is the oldest to be found today in the cemetery, recording the death of Catharine Kennedy, who died 104 years ago.

was the Rev. Frank Pettit, a member of St. Mary's in his youth. A missionary is also interred there Rev. Boniventure Buczynski, who came from Berlin.

St. Mary's was established as a cemetery about 1853, only five years after Wisconsin became a state on May 29, 1848. Among the area pioneers buried there are these:

"Catharine Kennedy, age 13, died July 10, 1853; Patrick Fene-lon, 18 years, died Dec. 25, 1854; Thomas McGaghan, died Aug. 7, 1855."

The above are the oldest graves still found in the cemetery although there are many dated in the 1860's, 1870's, 1880's, and the 1890's. The well kept, beautiful cemetery is still used today.
