Court Notes—Arrested on Charge of a Hellish Crime—Notes.

PARKERSBURG, November 12.—In the Circuit Court here to day the irrepressible Guy Green was found guilty of burglary.

Deputy Marshal J. K. Mehan arrested John Woofter, of Pennsboro, on a telegram from Ritchie C. H., and he was taken back by special constable A. S. McDougal this evening. It will be remembered that Woofter was charged with the hellish attempt to burn his own property on which he had heavy insurance, and the inmates, Daniel Childers and family, barely escaped with their lives, and this warrant was sworn out by Childers, who, it is supposed, has obtained more positive evidence against the accused. The testimony before the justice who Woofter was arrested before was purely circumstantial but of a damaging character. The result is awaited with interest.
